# Are your patients eligible?

- The patient must be getting treatment for the disease named in the assistance program to which he or she is applying.
- 2. The patient must have health insurance that covers his or her qualifying medication or product.
- 3. The patient's medication or product must be listed on PAN's list of covered medications.
- 4. The patient's income must fall at or below 400% or 500% of the Federal Poverty Level.
- 5. The patient must reside and receive treatment in the United States or U.S. territories.
